


#### Suites





#### Tony Hulman's Journey





## TONY HULMAN



The man behind the Indianapolis Motor Speedway: 1920s to his death in the late 1970s.

Tony is a handsome, charismatic leading man, a natural leader, problem solver, athlete, and adventurer. Privately, he suffers from undiagnosed OCD and despises public speaking. He has a personal obligation to the drivers, fans, and city to make the race safe and successful, even if it means questionable dealings.

## MARY JOSEPHINE FENDRICH HULMAN





Born into a cigar manufacturing empire, Mary was groomed for leadership by her doting father.

Despite aspirations to become a nun, she met and

married Tony Hulman, aligning the two wealthiest families in Indiana. After multiple miscarriages, they welcomed their only child, Mari (born "Mary").

Mary dedicated herself to church and philanthropy while hosting events during the Month of May. After Tony's death, Mary defied expectations by becoming the Chairman of the Speedway, earning respect in a maledominated field. Her resilience, humor, and leadership cemented her legacy as the matriarch of the Hulman family.

## MARI HULMAN GEORGE





Tony and Mary's only child, Mari, was reserved and elegant, with formidable intelligence and a biting wit. Passionate about horsepower, in all forms, she connected easily with drivers and fans. Mari dropped out of college, founded the H.O.W. (Hell on Wheels) Racing Team, and chaired IMS for 20 years.

She married driver Elmer George and was deeply involved in horse showing, breeding, and racing. The series follows her journey through Catholic boarding school, racing, and her complex relationship with Elmer.


## JACKIE JONES



Jackie is a sharp-witted, strikingly beautiful young woman from Terre Haute, IN. Raised by a jealous, alcoholic mother and an abusive stepfather, she escapes at 17 to live with her aunt and uncle in Speedway, IN. Despite her troubled past, Jackie's fierce independence and undeniable allure quickly draw her into the glamorous world of racing. Confident and resilient, she navigates life with a seductive blend of charm and toughness, determined to carve her own path.

Jackie becomes captivated by the thrilling, scandalous world of racing. Enticed by both its danger and allure, she balances the glamour of racing with the chaos of the Snake Pit. Her love life mirrors this daring world—dating a dangerous biker, falling for the king of the Snake Pit, and indulging in flings with drivers, testing her limits. Yet, through it all, Jackie stays grounded by her core values, rising above the turmoil around her.

At the Speedway, one in seven drivers died on the track. Balancing life and death, our characters are courted by politicians, threatened by gangsters, and tempted by movie stars. In just one episode, a romantic relationship blooms, a driver dies in a fiery crash, and Al Capone commits a murder.

#### LINDA VAUGHN




Linda Vaughn, known as the "First Lady of Motorsports," is a prominent figure in the racing world, particularly in American motorsports, where she became a symbol of glamour and excitement. Vaughn's relationship with the Hulman family is deeply connected through her presence at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway (IMS), where she became a beloved figure, frequently attending the Indy 500 and other major events hosted by the Hulman family

#### GUYTROLLINGER

Guy is a wild and crazy, uneducated roughneck, but with a friendly, caring, and nurturing side. He meets Mari and Elmer at Ruidoso Downs, a New Mexico horse track, where he's working one of the most dangerous jobs in the gate crew. At night he's a bouncer at one of the most popular bars in the city. He's hired by Mari and Elmer to be their horse trainer and develops a strong bond with Mari over their mutual love of animals. Elmer is jealous of their relationship. Mari and Guy never marry, but the two are in love and become life long partners after her husband's death.



#### ELMER GEORGE



Elmer was born with grit and determination, desperate to create a better life for himself. His dad died when he was four and he was raised by a hostile mother and three other siblings as they went through the shared trauma of the Dust Bowl and the Great Depression. With the temperament of TNT, oscillating between unexpressive to explosive, with little in between, he falls for Mari while driving for her racing team. The Hulmans disapprove of their union and tension haunts their 18-year marriage. Mari eventually files for divorce in 1976.

### "CHARLIE" WIGGINS



Charles Edwin "Charlie" Wiggins, born in 1897, was a top African American auto racer and mechanic from Evansville, Indiana. He built his own race cars, including the Wiggins Special, and won the Gold and Glory Sweepstakes four times between 1926 and 1933. This event was for Black drivers excluded from major races like the Indianapolis 500. A 1936 accident ended his driving career, costing him his right leg, but he continued as a skilled mechanic and mentor.


Wiggins passed away in 1979, leaving a legacy of resilience and excellence in motorsport.



## TIMELINE HIGHLIGHTS

## 1920S

- Mary Fendrich Hulman and Tony Hulman, Jr. marry in 1926, uniting two Indiana families.
- Tony Hulman's Clabber Girl Baking Powder campaign builds the family's fortune, leading to the eventual IMS purchase.



 Tony Hulman takes over Hulman & Company in 1931, transforming it into a major business through innovative advertising with Clabber Girl Baking Powder



- Tony Hulman purchases the Indianapolis Motor
   Speedway in 1945, saving it from demolition.
- The Indianapolis 500 is revived in 1946 under Tony's leadership, restoring its former glory.



- Wilbur Shaw dies in a plane crash in 1954, marking the end of an era at IMS.
- Tony Hulman assumes the role of delivering the iconic "Gentlemen, Start Your Engines!" command in 1955.

- Mary Hulman becomes the first woman to start the Indy 500 in 1978 with the famous command.

#### 1976 RACE HIGHLIGHTS

- Johnny Rutherford wins a rain-shortened race, marking the final victory for the Offenhauser engine.
- Janet Guthrie enters the Indy 500 but doesn't qualify, returning in 1977.
- Sid Collins broadcasts his last race due to health issues, later succumbing to ALS in 1977.

#### 1977-1978 EVENTS

- Tom Sneva breaks the 200 mph barrier at the Speedway.
- Janet Guthrie becomes the first woman to qualify for the Indy 500.
- Eight USAC officials die in a 1978 plane crash, sparking governance changes in IndyCar racing.

## LOCATIONS.



We'll spend a lot of time at the Speedway and Terre Haute, but other locations will frame the series as epic and eye-catching.

Mari and Elmer operated a dude ranch in Wyoming and spent much of their time there, adding a scenic western look and feel similar to that of "Yellowstone." This will be a key location for Seasons One and Two as well as Ruidoso Downs in New Mexico, "the Land Of Enchantment."


